Title

Creating an Ocean Soundscape using Body Percussion.

Objective(s)

The aim of the lesson plan if for the children to enabled to play body percussion instruments developing a sense of pulse, duration, tempo, pitch dynamics, structure and texture.

Skills Required

Listening, concentration, motor skills-finger clicking.

Learning objectives

The child should be enabled to:

Use body percussion, simple homemade and un-tuned instruments to create a soundscape which depicts the story "Sharing a Shell" by Julia Donaldson and Alex Scheffler or other suitable marine story.

Understand musical concepts such as: pulse (steady beat); duration (long / short, patterns, rhythm); tempo (fast / slow), pitch (high / low); dynamics (loud / soft); structure (same / different); texture (one sound / several sounds).

Learning activities

Talk and Discussion:

Read and discuss the story "Sharing a Shell" by Julia Donaldson and Alex Scheffler. Establish the potential and opportunities for the creation of a soundscape which depicts the movement of the sea –sounds of pebbles rolling, waves reaching shore, storm sounds, wind howling, waves crashing, crabs scuttling, and calm. The children then explore the sound potential of instruments and share their discoveries.

Hands on Approach:

Engage and experiment with clapping, finger clicking, stamping, knee patting, tongue clicking, and chest tapping to imitate or improvise rhythm.

Group Work / Pair Work/ Class:

The children, working collaboratively, create a musical narration of the story.

The children can perform their music and present the soundscape to each group or another classroom.

Please note: another suitable marine story can be used in this lesson plan if "Sharing
