If I were a fish, what would I be?

Objectives

The children will design and create a poster that describes a fish (or animal from the ocean) that they would like to be. The children will describe their favourite fish / marine animal's appearance, its habitat and the food it likes to consume by participating in oral language, reading and writing activities.

Skills required

The children must be able to appropriately use new vocabulary and phrases about their favourite fish. They should include information about the appearance of the fish, the personality of the fish, the habitat the fish lives in, as well as the food it eats.

Learning Objectives:

The children will be enabled to:

Learn the new vocabulary and phrases that are related to their favourite fish.

Participate in opened and closed paired work.

Develop their listening and writing skills of the language.

Learning Activities:

Opened paired work

The teacher will ask children the question "If you were a fish, what would you be?" The teacher will help the children to answer the question.

Closed paired work

In pairs, the children will ask each other:

- "What is your favourite fish?"
- "If you were a fish, what would you like to be?

If the children are struggling to answer these questions, the teacher can write the question and answer on the white board.

Research

The children are going to research their favourite fish. They can use computers and books based on fish for their research.

Poster designing

Now, the children are going to make a poster of their favourite fish. On the poster, they have to describe:

- What does the fish look like? (colour, texture of its skin, its size, eyes, mouth, teeth etc);
- What type of personality does the fish have? (kind, happy, funny, angry, bold etc);
- What is their habitat like? (lives amongst seaweed, in the sand, on the rocks, deep in the ocean, in shallow waters, in the coldest part of the world, in the warmest tropical waters etc);
- What food does the fish eat? (plankton, small fish, large fish, seaweed, birds, seals etc).

Presenting

The teacher will give each pair a chance to present their work to the whole-class.

Differentiation

- Higher and lower order questions
- Differentiate group activities and group roles so the individual abilities can be taken into account through the activities and tasks.
- Mixed-abilities grouping during group work
- Writing the questions and answers on the board, if required.

Assessment
