REPORT ON THE SEA AND INLAND FISHERIES FOR 1926, 1927 and 1928.

The upward trend of the Saorstát Sea fishing industry which started in 1923 continued to be maintained in the year 1926. An examination of the results given in the statistical tables shows that in that year as compared with 1925 the yield of our fisheries has been increased.

The total catch of sea fish (excluding sea-caught salmon and shellfish) landed in Saorstát ports in the year was 554,280 cwts. as compared with 497,412 cwts. landed in 1925. The total value of the catch in 1926 was £431,872 as compared with £341,297 in the preceding year.

Our exports of all kinds of fish, including salmon and fresh-water fish increased from 251,870 cwts. in 1925 to 321,962 cwts. in 1926.

In the year 1927 the improvement was maintained. The total quantity landed (excluding salmon and shell fish) was 637,417 cwts., and the total value of the landings was £450,456.

The landings for 1928 dropped to 459,347 cwts. and the total value to £423,283. The principal cause of the decline was the poor shoals of the herring and mackerel upon which the bulk of our fishermen rely. The decline in the catch of sea fish, excluding salmon and fresh-water eels was reflected in the smaller volume of exports and the corresponding increase in the imports of sea fish as will be seen in the following table:—

The number of power fishing vessels engaged in fishing shows a progressive increase during the three years under review. Steamers increased from 10 to 14, motor boats from 303 in 1926 to 317 in 1927, and 326 in 1928. This increase in power

driven vessels was set off by a decrease in sailing vessels and row boats which diminished from 3,994 in 1926 to 3,446 in 1927, and to 3,403 in 1928. The number of fishing craft of all kinds which did not take part in the fishing during 1927 was 1,031, and during 1928 was 942.

The number of men and boys engaged in the fishing boats as a whole-time occupation increased from 4,708 in 1926 to 5,506 in 1927, but owing to poor fishing in 1928 the numbers fell to 5,158. The part-time fishermen who take up fishing as a seasonal occupation in the Spring and Autumn, when they follow the inshore fishing for herrings and mackerel, numbered 9,301 in 1926, 7,762 in 1927, and 7,604 in 1928. This falling off may be mainly attributed to the succession of stormy seasons since 1926. Over 90 per cent. of the part-time fishermen work in row boats and sailing yawls, and these small craft are unable to fish in very rough weather.

The principal fishing in the three years was for herrings, the total landings in each year being :—

The quality of the Summer and Autumn herrings in 1927 was excellent, being an improvement on the quality in 1926. The 1928 herring was, however, disappointing and some unripe fish was cured at Dunmore for continental markets in the early Summer which hindered sales later when the quality had improved.

Mackerel fishing which comes next in importance gave a disappointing yield in proportion to the catching power exerted. The catch was 121,933 cwts. in 1926, and in 1927 it improved to 188,928 cwts., but in 1928 it declined to 85,836 cwts. This decline is attributable to the scarcity of this fish on our coasts.

Trawl and line-caught fish declined during the three years in quantity and value as is shown by the following summary :—

This decline was marked in respect of the steam trawlers operating from Dublin, their landings in 1928 being over 4,500 cwts. below those for the previous year.

The catch of shell fish, including lobsters, crabs, crayfish, etc., showed slight fluctuations during the three years, and still remains unduly low in spite of favourable markets. Bad

weather is ascribed as the principal cause. The Department has urged the lobster fishermen using canoes and yawls to get larger boats with motor power, but, so far, with little success.

DEPARTMENT'S FISHING OPERATIONS.

The scheme for utilising the steam and motor vessels in the Department's hands which were capable of being fitted out for fishing was continued during the three years under review. The total gross earnings of the vessels for these years amounted to £7,522. The running expenses while fishing, including outlay for fuel, oil, wages of paid hands, etc., amounted to £3,376, leaving a net sum of £4,146 to be divided between the fishermen and the Department. The fishermen received £2,328 and the Department retained the balance of £1,048. The cost of replacing nets, repairs and sundry charges for which the Department was liable as owners of the boats and gear, amounted, in the three years to £2,916, so that the net cost to the State of these operations was £1,868, without any provision being made for interest on capital and depreciation of property.

HERRING BRANDING.

The number of barrels of cured herrings branded with the State brand was as follows:—

The brand secured readier sales and increased prices on the Continental and American markets. Regulations have been made for the branding of mackerel, but up to the present the curers have not availed of the brand.

MARINE WORKS.

The construction of small landing places and improved facilities to existing landing places to meet the growing requirements of the fishing community was arranged for during the three years dealt with in this report. In 1926-7 there were five such works arranged for, the total cost of which amounted to £1,392 to which the Department contributed £845. In 1927-8 the cost of the works arranged for was £3,345 to which the Department agreed to contribute £1,624, and in 1928-9 the corresponding figures were £1,982 and £1,093.

The Commissioners of Public Works were engaged in carrying out extensive improvements at Dingle, including extension of the pier and dredging the navigation channel, during the period.

Preliminary arrangements for extension of the pier at Buncrana were made by them. The total cost of these works is estimated at £36,000 of which the State will bear £30,000.

FISHING DISASTER ON WEST COAST.

On 27th October, 1927, the west coast was visited by a sudden hurricane which struck the coast of Mayo and Galway just after the yawls engaged in mackerel fishing had put to sea. Forty-four lives were lost in the storm, twenty-five in Cleggan Bay, ten off Inishkea Islands, Blacksod, and nine in Killala Bay. In addition to this loss of life there was a heavy loss in boats and gear, and in the Letterfrack district of Co. Galway, where no lives were lost the destruction of fishing craft and nets was very heavy. The losses of boats and equipment were made good from public subscription, and the dependents of those who lost their lives were relieved from the same source.

SALMON AND FRESH WATER FISHERIES.

The run of salmon in 1926 was much better than in 1925 and the catch by drift nets in the open sea and by the weirs and fixed nets in estuaries was considerably in advance of the previous two years. In 1927 exact statistics of the salmon catch were obtained under the powers conferred by the Statistics Act, 1926, and the summary of the returns which appears in the Appendices to this Report shows that 1927 was an exceptionally good salmon year; but as the British fisheries were equally productive, the markets were heavily supplied, and prices in consequence were lower than in 1926 and 1928 which may be taken as fairly normal years.

Reports from the various fishery districts indicate that a good stock of breeding fish were on the spawning beds during the close season in each of the three years, and the increased staff of water bailiffs, with the assistance of the Garda Síochána, afforded greatly improved protection for the spawning fish.

The financial resources of the Boards of Conservators have been improved by the operation of the Fisheries Act, 1925. The annual revenue derived from rates and licence duties was £29,706 in 1928 as compared with £10,089 in 1923. This revenue has been expended on preservation and river watching with consequent improvement in the stock of fish. The amount spent by the Boards in preservation was £8,806 in 1923, while in 1928 it was £28,432.

HATCHERIES.

In addition to the two salmon hatcheries in Lismore and Glenties, the Department established a third hatchery at Blackcastle on the River Boyne in 1926. The capacity of the three

hatcheries is eight million ova. The quantity of ova and fry distributed from these hatcheries during the three years under review was :—

Difficulty in trapping a sufficient number of spawning fish for the hatcheries was the chief reason why the quantity of ova was below capacity.

RURAL INDUSTRIES.

The Department had under its control during the three years dealt with in this Report, knitting, lacemaking and embroidery industries at 33 centres all of which, with one exception, are situated in the Gaeltacht. The average annual turn-over of these industries for the three years was £16,500, out of which the local workers received £8,050 a year. Owing to the continued decline in the lace-making industry several centres were in process of changing over to machine knitting during the period.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE GAELTACHT.

In accordance with the decision of the Government on the recommendations of the Coimisiún na Gaeltachta dealing with the economic development of certain areas hitherto regarded as areas of hopeless congestion in Western Donegal, Erris (Co. Mayo) and Connemara (Co. Galway), conjoint action between the various Departments specially concerned in the solution of the problem has now been provided for. A committee is now constituted under the chairmanship of the Minister for Lands and Fisheries and composed of representatives from the following Departments :—

Finance, Local Government and Public Health, Education, Industry and Commerce, Agriculture, Public Works, and Lands and Fisheries.

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Department of Lands and Fisheries acts as vice-chairman. The Committee began its sittings on 5th October, 1928, and meets fortnightly.

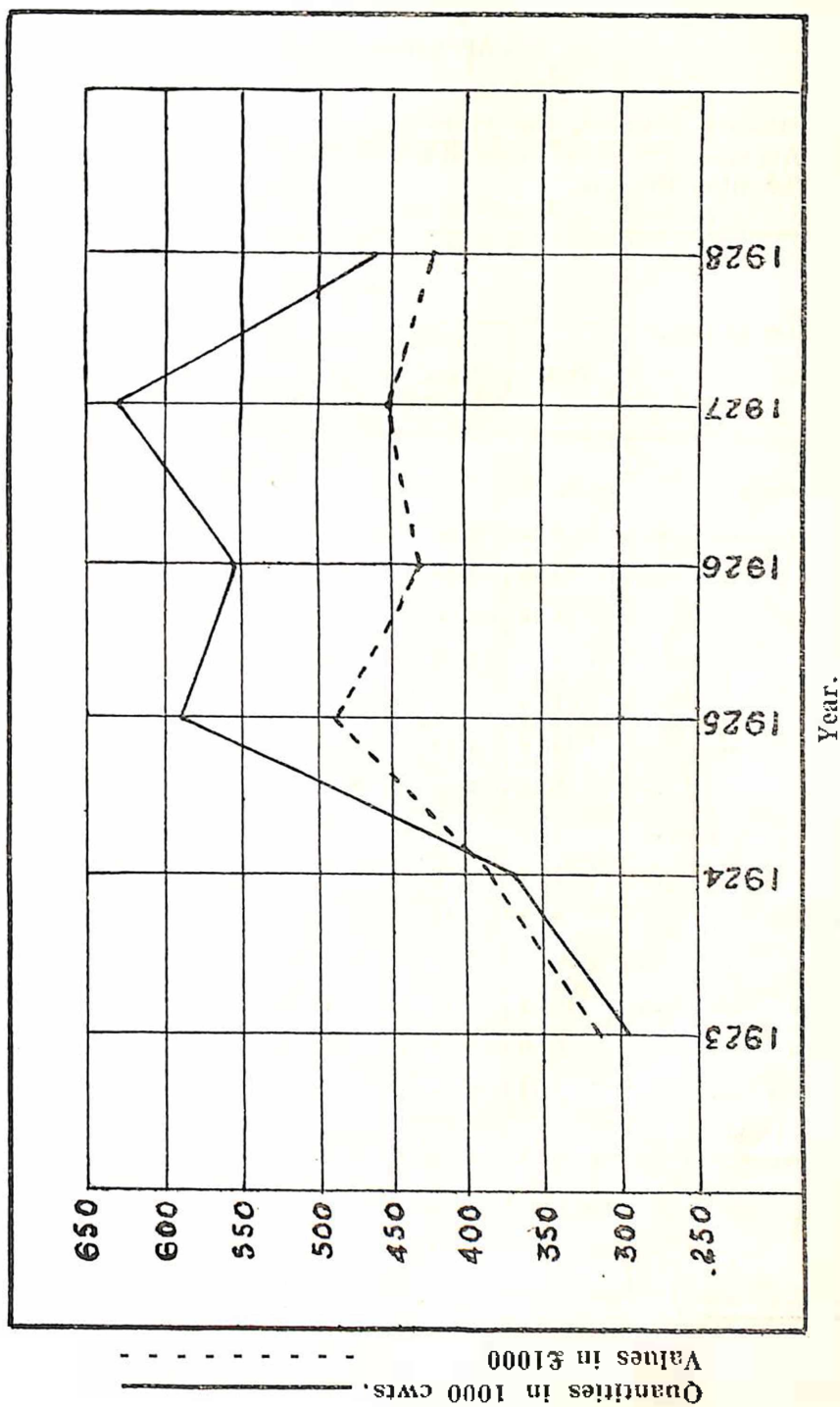

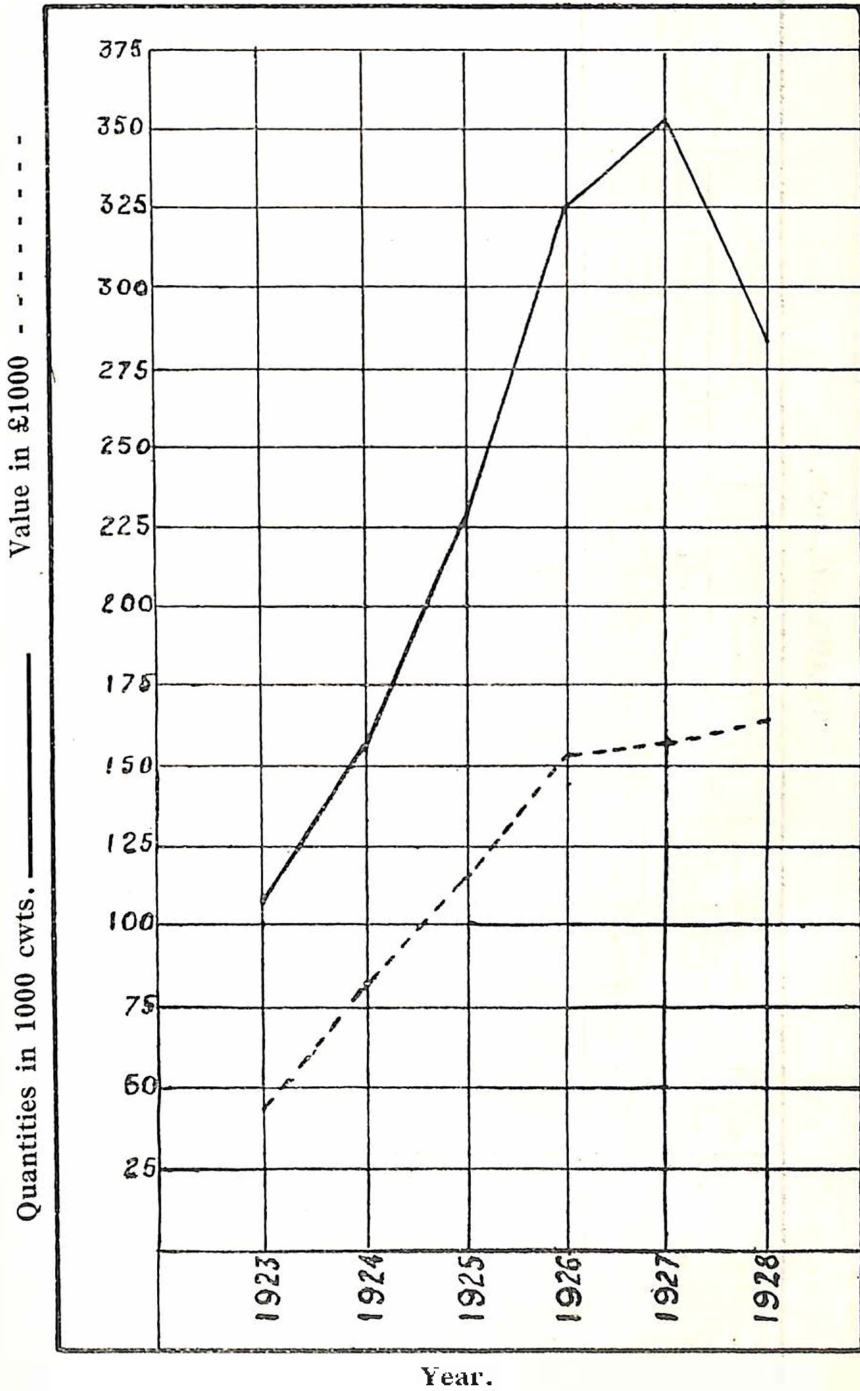

APPENDIX No. 19.

Statistics of Salmon, Sea Trout and Eels Captured in the Year 1927.

The Statistics Act, 1926 (Section 2), empowered the Minister for Industry and Commerce to collect, compile, abstract and (subject to the provisions of that Act) publish statistics, including those relating to the sea and inland fisheries of Saorstát Éireann. Under the authority conferred by Section 3 (S.S.1) of the same Act the Executive Council by Order No. 25 of 1927 transferred to the Minister for Fisheries the aforesaid powers with regard to the sea and inland fisheries in so far as concerned actual captures or landings.

The Minister for Fisheries, by Order No. 45 of 1927, directed the collection of certain information relative to the capture or landings of salmon, sea trout and eels; and the following tables contain in summarised form the information so collected. In presenting these tables it is desired to call attention to the following points:—

The year 1927 was remarkable for the heavy run of salmon which obtained during the early portion of that year, and consequently it would be unwise to deduce too much from the accompanying figures until they can be viewed comparatively with those for a later year. The figures for the year 1929 are at the moment under compilation.

Owing to unavoidable delay in getting out Orders Nos. 25 and 45 of 1927, the prescribed forms were not in the hands of anglers and netters until that season had well advanced, and some of these persons not having kept precise records of their catches were only able to furnish estimates thereof. This defect will not apply to the collection for the year 1929 or any subsequent year for which it may be desired to gather the information.

The number of rod licences issued is given in Table III. Other licences issued were 812 for draft nets, 567 for drift nets, 258 for snap nets, 8 for pole nets, 11 for bag nets, 20 for stake nets, 1 for a head weir, 39 for boxes or cribs, 19 for loop nets, 2 for sweepers and 10 for cross lines. Licences for engines for the capture of eels numbered 325.
